The University of Tokyo Faculty Position in Plasma Science

1. Job title and number of positions available: One position for Professor
2. Start of Term: The earliest possible date after 1st December 2021
3. Term of Employment: Non fixed-term until age 60. An extension of employment beyond age 60 (until age 65) will be decided after a faculty development review and evaluation.
4. Probation Period: 6 months from the start date of employment
5. Place of Work: Graduate School of Frontier Sciences, The University of Tokyo (5-1-5 Kashiwanoha, Kashiwa-shi, Chiba)
6. Affiliation: Plasma Science Group, Department of Advanced Energy, Graduate School of Frontier Sciences, The University of Tokyo
7. Content of Work Duties: The successful candidate will be expected to conduct research and education in plasma science and fusion science, and to undertake organizational management in the University.
8. Working Hours: Based on the discretionary work system for professional work, working hours are deemed to be 7 hours and 45 minutes per day.
9. Days off: Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays and end-of-year holidays (December 29 to January 3)
10. Paid Leave: Annual leave, summer leave, bereavement leave etc.
11. Wages, etc.: Basic Salary will be decided after taking into account the successful candidate's academic and professional background. Bonus payments (twice a year), commuting allowance, and other allowances as well as a system for regular wage raises are provided in accordance with the related regulations of the University of Tokyo.
12. Insurance: The successful candidate will be automatically enrolled in the insurance scheme provided by the Mutual Aid Association of MEXT (Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) and employment insurance.
13. Requirements:
 - (1) Ph. D or an equivalent qualification
 - (2) Notable achievements of research and education in plasma science and fusion science.

- (3) Sufficient Japanese and English proficiency to give lectures, instruct students and participate in organizational management, etc.

- (4) List of educational activities
- (5) List of other achievements and activities (prizes, acquisition of competitive funds, contribution to academic society and scientific conferences, contribution to society, patents, etc.)
- (6) Outline of your future plans for research and education (up to 2 pages of A4 size paper)
- (7) Names and contact information with Email address for three references who can provide independent assessment of the candidate (Nationality does not matter)
